



## **Pinkerbelle™ Rose**

*Rosa 'Meivanae'*

### **Description:**

Spicy, verberna scented blooms on upright bushy plants, perfect for cutting gardens, borders or fresh cut flower arrangements; cream colored roses with pink picotee edges and a lavender flush sit among medium green foliage; excellent disease resistance

### **Ornamental Features**

Pinkerbelle Rose is smothered in stunning lightly-scented semi-double creamy white flowers with pink overtones and a lavender flare at the ends of the branches from late spring to late summer. The flowers are excellent for cutting. It has dark green deciduous foliage which emerges dark red in spring. The oval compound leaves turn yellow in fall. The spiny brick red bark adds an interesting dimension to the landscape.

### **Landscape Attributes**

Pinkerbelle Rose is a multi-stemmed deciduous shrub with an upright spreading habit of growth. Its average texture blends into the landscape, but can be balanced by one or two finer or coarser trees or shrubs for an effective composition.

This is a high maintenance shrub that will require regular care and upkeep, and is best pruned in late winter once the threat of extreme cold has passed. It is a good choice for attracting bees to your yard. Gardeners should be aware of the following characteristic(s) that may warrant special consideration;

- Disease
- Spiny

Pinkerbelle Rose is recommended for the following landscape applications;

- Mass Planting
- Hedges/Screening

### **Planting & Growing**

Pinkerbelle Rose will grow to be about 5 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 3 feet. It tends to fill out right to the ground and therefore doesn't necessarily require facer plants in front, and is suitable for planting under power lines. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 20 years.

This shrub should only be grown in full sunlight. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. To help this plant achieve its best flowering performance, periodically apply a flower-boosting fertilizer from early spring through into the active growing season. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid.
